Venice bungalow built by Abbot Kinney asking \$2.985M

Just steps from the beach, and it comes with seven parking spaces

So close to the ocean you could skip stones from it, this sweet Swiss chalet bungalow was built by Venice founder Abbot Kinney for his son Thornton in 1906. A century later, the cottage received a thorough renovation and a new wing, courtesy of Venice architect Michael Hricak.



Now measuring approximately 2,800 square feet, the two-story home has four bedrooms and three baths. Features include oak floors, built-in seating and shelving, beveled glass windows, blindingly white walls, Carrara marble countertops, and highend appliances.



Sliding glass doors lead to a backyard patio with built-in barbecue and fire pit. There's also a rooftop deck offering picturesque palm tree-studded seaside views, a three-car garage, and space for up to four other vehicles. Last sold for \$2.8 million in 2014, it's now asking \$2.985 million.
